



2011 Petite Sirah

Appellation: Napa Valley (100%) Single Vineyard

Composition: Petite Sirah (plus a smaller amount of a special 4th dimension grape

from the same property)

Winemaking: The fruit was punched cap fermented and barrel aged for 32 months

in selected French and American Oak barrels then blended prior to

bottling.

Tasting Notes: Classic "Iron fist wrapped in the velvet glove". Powerful and dense

currants and blackberry notes with hints of raspberry accents. Spice notes add an underlying complexity. Full fruit, floral and graphite aromatics. Rich and very full bodied. Powerful and exotic with big structure and yet very polished on very long dry berry-like finish.

Special Note: This is the second wine made from these young Petite Sirah vines.

The dynamic results defy the notion that young vines won't make complete and complex wines. While many 2011 wines struggled to

get fully ripe, these grapes had no problem.

Less than 60 cases were made
